

William Huber P. E. William Huber is the President of The Wild Horse Group, a Government Relations Company he launched after retiring from government service in 2007. His company is currently serving as Interim Public Works Director/City Engineer for the City of Los Alamitos and is actively involved in providing government relations services to the County of Orange for its \$75-80 million extension of La Pata Avenue in South Orange County as well as other smaller projects. Prior to forming his own company, William worked for the City of San Juan Capistrano for 16 years, having served for three years as Assistant City Manager and for 13 years as Engineering and Building Services Director. He also served as City Engineer for the cities of Irvine and Carson. William "earned his stripes" with the City of Ontario, where he spent 16 years working his way up through the ranks from Engineering Aide to Chief Engineer. All in all, he has spent nearly 40 years serving municipalities throughout Southern California.

During his service to the communities, William has managed and successfully directed a great number of projects and programs. Projects of note include managing the City of San Juan Capistrano's Open Space efforts; initiating and advancing the Ortega Highway Interchange at I-5 freeway; developing and implementing citywide priorities programs; developing citywide Strategic Transportation Programs; and developing city fee programs to help balance budgets. He also worked on the initial phase of the Alameda Corridor Project while with the City of Carson and was directly responsible for his city receiving the first federal funding for grade separations and road improvements.
