It is with great pleasure that I nominate Kyle Anderson, PE for the 2014 ASCE Younger Engineer Award. Kyle has many outstanding technical and leadership capabilities that I have witnessed over the last couple of years, and which I will outline with this submittal for your consideration. In addition, attached are a number of supporting documents that show Kyle's commitment to ASCE and our profession.

During my term as President of the SLO Branch in 2012-2013, Kyle volunteered to fill a need for an open position on our Board as assistant newsletter editor. Upon joining the Board, Kyle immediately "raised the bar" for himself and began coordinating a new Younger Member Forum in our Branch. This was no easy task, as he had to research the need for this group, provide a proposal to the Board and ultimately establish the Group. Kyle took a leadership position and began organizing social functions for the increasing number of Younger Members in the ASCE Branch. Through his efforts, the Younger Member Group was a success and eventually recognized as the newest Younger Member Forum in our Branch and the Los Angeles Section. The transition from Group status to an officially recognized Forum was a significant secondary accomplishment, since a new set of bylaws had to be written and coordination with ultimate approval from our Board and the Section was gained. But, Kyle did not stop at these accomplishments. In the past year, he has created and managed his own YMF officer board and taken their activities beyond the social realm to education. Recent meetings have included speakers on financial management by local professionals and contract law from the American Council of Engineering Consultants. In addition, Kyle and his YMF board have secured a SPAG Grant to complete an ASCE Infrastructure Report Card for San Luis Obispo County!

Not surprisingly, Kyle's accomplishments go well beyond ASCE. With a Master's degree in Water Resource Engineering, he is an integral part of our technical team at Rick Engineering, and in a very short time has become a key player in many of our stormwater related projects. Kyle is also a volunteer for the NCEES, serving on a committee in Sacramento that coordinates the review and updates to the PE exam. He has also provided volunteer lectures at Cal Poly for general civil engineering students. It is not surprising that he set's the bar high for physical fitness as well, regularly participating in marathon events.

As you will see from the attached documents, his industry colleagues have the same opinion about Kyle that I do. I am confident that his accomplishments make him a strong candidate for this award. ## Letter of support for Kyle Anderson ASCE Outstanding Younger Member

I'd like to express my support for Kyle Anderson's nomination for ASCE Outstanding Younger Member. When Kyle moved to San Luis Obispo, he saw that there was not a local YMF group and took the initiative to create one. There had been unsuccessful attempts to build a group here in the past. He took the initiative to attend ASCE's Western Regional Younger Member Council meeting in conjunction with the Multi-Regional Leadership Conference to learn from other YMF groups in ASCE Regions 8 and 9 and to learn from ASCE leaders and staff.

Local ASCE leadership had some concerns in the past that creating a YMF group in the area may reduce the available volunteer pool in our small community. What Kyle has been able to do is to actually show the opposite. By creating an active YMF group, he has shown that it has increased the pool of civil engineers participating in ASCE events because we now have activities that appeal to a broader range of member interests. I expect that we will see some of the current YMF officers move up into leadership positions at the local branch over time. This will work to strengthen the San Luis Obispo Branch because Branch officers with YMF leadership experience will bring that experience to the Branch. Also, with our strong local ASCE student chapter, the YMF group is now serving to show our ASCE students members that there is a home for them in ASCE after they graduate.

Kyle's enthusiasm and leadership were what the local group needed to create a YMF group. Successful ASCE activities and groups are the result of members like Kyle that will volunteer to step up and lead. I've had the pleasure of watching Kyle build the YMF group here in San Luis Obispo from the ground up. What he's built in a short period of time is impressive. I've now been to several well attended San Luis Obispo Branch YMF events in the past year and a half, and am amazed at how quickly Kyle and his team have gotten the group up and running. They've had a very positive response to their events. Not only have the events been well attended, but the events have also brought together Younger Members, Student Members, and Branch members.

## **Robert P. Stearns Obituary**



SCS Engineers (SCS) announces with profound sadness that Robert P. Stearns founding principal, Chairman of the Board, and former president, passed away on August 1, 2013, at his home in Idyllwild, California. He was 75.

In his role as President during most of his 36-year career at SCS, Bob was widely recognized for applying engineering principles to support and improve waste industry business practices, and for his commitment to the ethical practice of engineering.

Retiring from SCS in 2006, Bob remained active as SCS's Chairman of the Board and in many volunteer positions. Bob was inducted into the Environmental Industries Association "Hall of Fame" in 2003; was named a "Professional Achievement Award – Life Member" by the Solid Waste Association of North America in 2009; and served the American Society of Civil Engineers in many capacities, including as Chairman of ASCE's National Ethics Committee.
